

Dr Dane Cheasley PhD, BSc (Hons)

Dr Dane Cheasley is a Senior Research Scientist at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre, Melbourne and an Adjunct Senior Research Fellow at both the University of Western Australia School of Biomedical Sciences and the Harry Perkins Institute of Medical Research, Perth.

He is also an invited Scientific Member of the International Consortium of Low-Grade Serous Ovarian Cancer (ICLC) and serves as an ambassador for the Australian Gynaecological Cancer Foundation. As a recognised leader in cancer research, he specialises in breast cancer and rare ovarian cancers, with a focus on improving diagnosis and patient outcomes.

Dr Cheasley explores how breast cancer develops in high- and low-density breast tissue and how genetic testing can help guide treatment and identify women at higher risk. He is currently assessing the feasibility of implementing universal genetic testing for breast cancer in Western Australia.

Earlier in his career, he was a Postdoctoral Researcher at the Walter and Eliza Hall Institute of Medical Research, Melbourne, and has been cited as an author or contributor in 24 published research papers.

Dr Cheasley holds a Bachelor of Science from La Trobe University, Melbourne, which he completed in 2007, followed by a first class Honours degree in Oncology and Cancer Biology in 2008, and a PhD in the same field in 2013.

His ongoing research aims to refine diagnostic tools, advance personalised treatment approaches and improve outcomes for women affected by cancer.
